Pastor's Page



Throughout October, I've had the blessing of meeting quite a few of you in Meet & Greets, which are meetings intended to help us get to know one another a little better. Caroline Carlin, our Staff Parish Relations Chair, put out the invitation for people to host each gathering, and then created a sign-up sheet to coordinate attendance at them. I'm so grateful for Caroline, along with our willing hosts and all who came to these gatherings, as these events are such an important tradition for all of us when there is a pastoral change.

Some notable trends have emerged from our conversations together, so I thought you might like to hear about some of them:

- Many of you talked about the pastor who was here when you first came to Good Samaritan UMC...but even more of you talked about the influence and encouragement of someone who was not the pastor, and how that person helped you to feel welcomed and included.
- Some of you came to Good Samaritan UMC specifically because you
 already knew about our music department, our aim for social justice,
 our strong programming for all ages, or our values...and you mentioned
 important leaders by name (mostly congregation members, but also
 some staff members) because they exemplified living out these values
 within our community or made a difference in your faith journey.
- Many of you first visited Good Samaritan UMC because a friend or neighbor invited you, or alternately you were searching for a faith community after a big life event (a move, a marriage or divorce, a child, etc.)...and you've stayed because of the ongoing relationships you've enjoyed here.

In our Meet & Greets we also answered the following question: "God is calling this church to...." While it is clear that pain remains related to how staffing changes unfolded over the last year, the answers to this question mostly focused on reinventing ourselves, uniting, and for generally more active engagement, so we've got some work to do together on all this. That said, I think the one thing I want to encourage you with is this: the characteristics about Good Samaritan UMC summarized above have stood the test of time...they seem to be in our DNA! With all that is in our future (both known and unknown), these attributes are worth carrying forward with us. Indeed, our future relies on all of us engaging in this effort together.

Church Conference





Congregational Care

Prayer for November

Gracious and loving God,

Surely, we each have much to be grateful for. For some of us it's our health, for others our relationships, our homes, our careers, experiences that inspire or excite us, practices that nourish or equip us, our freedom, safety, or sense of purpose. We may be grateful for sunrises or forests, the sound of ocean waves or the view of a starry night. Perhaps we are grateful for life itself and creation in its totality.

And yet, God, gratitude is a tricky thing, too often tied to shame and shoulds. Our sense that we "ought" to be grateful often inhibits us from also being human and real. So, God of life, this year we ask that you help us to be and feel and practice that which is most honest and true for us each, right here, right now.

Let us be both grateful AND sad, or blessed AND afraid, or full of love AND full of anger and pain simultaneously, if that's the truth of our experience. Let our joy and our gratitude be deeply authentic and let our depletion, overwhelm, loneliness, or grief be met with compassion.

Through it all, God, remind us that we are held in and by your endless grace. Let us know what it is to experience a love that embraces us just as we are, where we are. Help us to offer such graces to one another. We pray all of these things in your holy name, Amen.

What's All This About Pronouns?

A pronoun is a word (such as he, she, you, we or they) that is used instead of a noun. Some of you have noticed and inquired about the pronouns identified in the email signatures of several staff members. Many of us are familiar with a binary construction of gender where he/him or she/her pronouns are the norm, but not everyone identifies with these pronouns. That's where gender-neutral pronouns come in, such as they/them/their, or ze/hir/hirs (pronounced "zee/here/heres") or ey/em/eir (pronounced "ay/em/airs"). Surveys suggest that as many as 25% of LGBTQ youth use pronouns such as they/them or a combination of he/they or she/they.

Asking and correctly using someone's pronouns shows respect. Using the wrong pronouns once you know someone's pronouns can make them feel invalidated, dismissed or



alienated. And fostering an environment where pronouns are identified so that people know what to use for individuals is important in creating an inclusive environment. It is also very helpful when interacting with people whose first names are less common, gender ambiguous, o from a culture you are not familiar with. Identifying and using pronouns may be uncomfortable at first, but it is an important step in providing the kind of hospitality and inclusivity Good Samaritan UMC is known for.



COME SEE A POWERFUL FILM

on Sunday, November 21, 2021 at 6:30 pm! Good Sam will be showing "For They Know Not What They Do", a powerful exploration of the intersection of religion, sexual orientation and gender identity in America. One evangelical church family was encouraged to put their son, Ryan, in conversion therapy; a life-long Presbyterian couple was shocked when their youngest boy came out to them as a transgender woman; a Catholic couple was greatly concerned about their gay son; and a mixed-race couple whose child endured self-harm before their parents' acceptance enabled them to come to terms with their gender.

Alongside these family stories of faith, rejection, validation, tragedy and triumph, the film weaves together unique perspectives from religious leaders. Through love, reconciliation, and acceptance, "For They Know Not What They Do" takes us on a journey of understanding what connects us all and gives us the courage to embrace each other.

This **90 minute film** is appropriate for all ages. After viewing it, stay for the **half hour discussion** afterwards. Masks and social distancing will be required. Sign up through our website.

Community Not Charity Learning Series

Simpson Housing is offering training called "Community Not Charity: Your Part in Creating Systemic Change". Breauna Dorelus from Connecting the Cause is our speaker.

"Part 1: White Saviorism in Volunteering" on October 30th, 10 AM - Noon

During this first training we will discuss exactly where we've gone wrong in volunteerism, and how current service practices are harmful and go against true community-centered work. We will also share what it means to keep community at the center of service and the mindset changes it takes to get there.

In this second training, we will take a deep dive into reshaping the future of volunteerism and what it will take to get us there. We'll tackle the systemic changes necessary to continue the work outside of formal volunteering while also taking accountability for each of our parts in creating a more just nonprofit sector.

We distributed almost \$15,000 in October to various charitable endeavors. This includes \$2,000 for educational ones like the ABC, the Wesley Foundation, and Joyce Preschool; \$2,500 for alleviating food insecurity with groups like Feed My Starving Children, the Joyce Food Shelf, Meals on Wheels, and VEAP; \$5,000 for helping with housing security with groups like Beacon, Emma Norton (Woman's shelter), Hearts and Hammers, and Simpson Housing (for Afghan refugees); and UMCOR (relief for Hurricane Ida); \$5,500 for local families and children we're helping individually after they're vetted by a social worker.

Good Sam is involved in four of their many programs:

1. Have an extra musical instrument for the youth at 66 West in Edina? Beacon is now collecting used musical instruments for them. 66 WEST is one of the 21 buildings in the metro, with 660 homes (apartments) that Beacon has created. Good Sam has really supported this one for homeless youth.

2. Beacon's BRING IT HOME MN is their legislative work to secure money for affordable housing, rent subsidies, and rent stabilization! They've accomplished much but they're still really pushing to get it passed this coming year. We need to promote support with our legislators.

3. Want to help poor people with their housing?

- . MAKE YOUR VOICE HEARD on November 1 - only 30 minutes! On the first of every month, Beacon hosts a **RENT IS DUE** Zoom session at 8:30 am to give us a 15-minute update on their affordable housing efforts, and then the last 15-minutes is when we all do their Action Steps which is contacting our Minnesota politicians. They give you a script to say over the phone and/or to write in an email regarding a special issue, plus the links to those people, so it is really EASY. Check their website for the link.

4. Beacon's FAMILIES MOVING FORWARD program is in transition because of Covid so families aren't being housed in churches right now. Good Sam has been involved with this program for years but we need co-chairs to organize our involvement. It would be very little work since FMF is just providing meals to families

housed in hotels.

Maintenance Minute




It is that time of year again where we will be turning on the boilers here at Good Sam. Luckily Good Sam has some pretty high efficient boilers that have had zero problems since being installed brand new 7 years ago. We have 2 total. One would be enough to heat the building but when boilers are installed it is always a good thing to have that back up just in case there is an issue

with one. It takes a special boiler license to be the boiler operator in a commercial building. Each day the boilers have to have pressures logged and certain components tested daily/weekly/monthly and yearly, to make sure of safe operation.

Here is a picture of our new gas lines that were installed on our roof. This is just the portion over the nursery. We went from copper to a much stronger galvanized steel. This needed to be done because ice dams were bending the copper pipes. It was a situation that could have become serious if the pipes had ever fully given out and snapped.


