

especially without really knowing what it entails. As such, we thought it might be helpful to review what you can expect to receive should you choose to join the prayer chain, either for a trial or permanently.


This simple document is generally grounded in a brief prayer or poem as an invitation to become spirit-aligned prior to reading the rest of the chain. Following this introduction, you'll find a list of recent prayer requests as submitted by members of this community. As a general guideline, specific prayer requests are outlined in detail for two weeks and then removed while more general intercessions may remain for a series of months or more. Additionally, when members or friends of the community have died, we try to announce both their passing and any relevant memorial or funeral service information in this section so that we can lift them and their loved ones up in prayer in the days and weeks following their death.

Following our prayer concerns, we name those who have specifically requested prayers for ongoing and/or recent medical issues. Those identified here stay on the prayer chain until they or a loved one requests that they be removed. Finally, we close with an opportunity to hold up recent joys and gratitudes from within the life of the community, either personally or collectively.

All in all, the prayer chain is a collective offering in which we are invited to hold one another in light, peace, and love from near and far. As we get ready for fall, and all the busyness that brings to our lives I wanted to touch base and give you a few ideas on how to include sacred moments in your every day life:

- Give you kiddos a little blessing as you are waiting in the car line to drop them off at school.
- Create a gratitude jar, where you write on a little slip of paper something you're grateful for, and have everyone contribute once a week (or once a day, when you have the hang of it).
- When you see an emergency vehicle go by, pray for everyone's safety and health in the situation.

### **Our Hearts Ache for Kentucky**



For over 40 years, Good Samaritan has sent work teams of youth and adults to the **Appalachian Mountains** 

to help make homes warmer, safer and dryer. Many of those years of service with ASP have been in the area of eastern Kentucky hit hard by recent flooding, and our hearts and prayers go out to the families and the communities whom we have served.

This year, 40% of the Minnesota Annual Conference Love Offering is going to the Central Appalachian Missionary Conference (CAMC) for their Project Flood Relief ministry with the goal of building 100 flood clean up buckets and 40 hygiene kits in response to several years of flooding. Now their need will be even greater.

Good Samaritan donated \$1,000 to the Love Offering in June. ## **Financial Update**

The table shows Good Samaritan's finances for the month of July and July year-to-date.

- July 2022 current month income of \$40,387 was below plan by \$9,484. Expenses were lower than plan, but still resulted in a net income of (\$12,001).
- As you know, the vast amount of Good Samaritan's expenses are fixed (personnel and building/property) – so there is still a need for income to support the church.

# **Trustees**

### Sanctuary Roof Replacement

We are planning to have the sanctuary roof replaced this fall. During a routine roof inspection, Dan Green, our building engineer, observed that the HVAC units had extensive hail damage. Upon further inspection, he noticed that the roof had hail damage as well. Dan notified the Trustees and contacted the insurance company. The insurance adjuster inspected the roof and HVAC units and confirmed that we had a claim.

Over the past year the Trustees, with the help of Dan and Pastor Carol, have solicited bids from a number of roofing companies and have been in negotiations with the insurance company. The claim was finally approved on August 9, 2022 and a roofing company has been selected to do the work.

The work will include replacement of the sanctuary roof, replacement of one HVAC unit, and repairs to an additional seven HVAC units. The small garage roof had extensive hail damage and will also be replaced. To tidy up the exterior of the church, we will also have the flashing around the bell tower roof replaced. The bell tower flashing is not covered under the claim so the church will pay approximately \$3,000 to have this part of the job done.

Due to the supply chain issues that the building trades have experienced over the past couple of years, the material orders need to be placed so the delivery dates can be confirmed and a start date set.

The roofing company is aware of the functions of the church and will work around any services that occur during the workweek.

The Trustees will provide an update once we have confirmation of the start date.

## Maintenance Minute: Ready for Back to School

The summer months at Good Sam are always very busy behind the scenes - for example, deep cleaning the school wing and nursery. This includes top to bottom dusting, light fixture and wall cleaning, window washing, bathroom floors scrubbing and grout cleaning, carpet

scrubbing and tile/terrazzo floor stripping and recoating. This is done every summer in preparation for a new school year. It is rewarding to make a tile or terrazzo floor that is scratched and dull in places look brand new all over again! It also prolongs the life of these floors.

All of the tiled classrooms and school hallway floors are original to Good Sam from back in 1960. You may never guess that when looking at them after I refinish them. The school hall is a floor called terrazzo. It is a poured-in floor and if it is properly and regularly maintained, it is more durable and can last hundreds of years, even longer than a polished concrete floor (which is what we have in the sanctuary).

Some interesting notes on it - it is said that archeologists have found terrazzo-type floors in ruins in Turkey dating back 8,000-9,000 years. However, they were "officially" invented in Venice, Italy around 500 years ago. The first terrazzo floor in the US was poured in by Italian craftsmen in 1890. Many of those floors still are used to this day. You will find a lot of terrazzo flooring in high traffic places like schools and retail stores, due to their durability, fairly easy maintenance and longevity.

With proper care, the floors here at Good Sam will continue to shine on and welcome all!
