Happy New Year to you and yours! There is much to look forward to, so this month I'm sharing a variety of things to help keep you informed.

### Minnesota Annual Conference Welcomes New Bishop

A new bishop, Lanette Plambeck, will begin serving the Dakotas-Minnesota episcopal area, starting January 1, 2023. She was one of three new bishops elected at the North Central Jurisdictional Conference in Fort Wayne, Indiana, in November of this year. I was privileged to be a clergy delegate from Minnesota taking part in the election and assignment process.

Bishop Lanette grew up in western Iowa and most recently served as director of clergy leadership and excellence as well as assistant to the bishop in the Iowa Annual Conference. Prior to that she served in a number of urban and rural settings, including as chaplain at Morning-side University in Sioux City, IA.

This is what she said about the nature of the church: "The church at its best is generative in its disciple-making, engaged in the means of grace, working toward justice, especially with the poor and marginalized. Jesus' 'on earth as it is in heaven' goal is nothing less than behaving as if God is leading and loving us toward something bigger than ourselves."

From time to time I will share a writing of hers in the newsletter or on our Facebook page, so I wanted you to have a sense of her as she arrives.

Learning Your Limits a Resource Session



## **Good Samaritan Missions Team Report**

Thank you for your generosity that has made it possible for Good Samaritan to contribute \$5,000 to UMCOR for US Disaster Relief. This has been a challenging year for disaster response and recovery and this is one way to make a difference.

Good Samaritan, with your help, is making a difference supporting education and diversity by contributing \$500 to the Thomas Educational Scholarship Fund at Camphor Memorial United Methodist Church in St Paul MN. In 2022 scholarships were awarded ranging from \$500 to \$1,000 to five recipients because of the generous support of other Methodist Churches, Camphor Church members and other donors. The 2022 awardees are attending major universities. The goal for the future is to increase the number of recipients and the amount of the scholarships.

# **Bring It Home Legislation**

Minnesota is facing a housing crisis. 550,000 Minnesotans - from every corner of the state - are at risk of losing their home every month because their rent is too high. Rent vouchers help these people stay in their homes and landlords get what they deserve. They are proven to be the most effective policy to help with housing instability.

Because the voucher program is vastly underfunded, three out of four people who qualify for rent vouchers do not get one. Our kids, our seniors, our working parents, our communities are paying the price. This lack of investment is a daily penalty on tens of thousands of our friends and neighbors and fellow Minnesotans.

Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative, which we know because of their Families Moving Forward program, has been been fighting for this important legislation called Bring it Home MN (www.BringItHomeMinnesota.org). Help them fight: contact your state legislators https://openstates.org/ find\_your\_legislator/ and tell them to use part of

our vast surplus to fund rent vouchers.

# The Good Samaritan Foundation

### Foundation 2022 Year-End Report

During 2022, The Board of Directors of The Good Samaritan Foundation awarded seven grants totaling \$15,000 from The Outreach Fund. Recipients were:

- Star Lake Wilderness Camp \$2500 for camper scholarships
- UNICEF \$2000 aid to Ukrainian Children's Fund
- Never Surrender Inc. Black Woods Blizzard Tour \$1000. Funds raised go to individuals
  living with ALS, their fulltime family care givers and research. Dan Rogers Green will be
  riding his snowmobile in this event in February 2023.
- Grace Place Food Pantry \$2750 for food assistance at the Grace Place School and community in Naples, Florida
- Project AgGrad \$2000. This is a MN Annual Conference project to support agriculture graduate students at the U of MN and other universities who return to their countries to teach and work in agriculture to improve farming.
- Stonebridge World School \$2000 grant to help fund an after-school debate team at the middle school level
- Simpson Food Pantry \$2750 in funds to assist moving the food pantry to a temporary location

In October, the Board of Directors asked the congregation to take up the challenge of adding \$30,000 to The Foundation's three funds in honor of The Foundations 30<sup>th</sup> year in 2023. Since that challenge, \$10,710 has been given to the Foundation. Thank you to those donors!!

## **Roof Update**

October 17, 2022, marked the beginning of the roof replacement project. It was discovered some time ago that we had hail damage to the steel roof on the Sanctuary. After quite a bit of conversation with our insurance company, along with some supply chain delays, we were at a point where work to replace the roof could begin. BL Dalsin Roofing was contracted to do the work. They provided regular updates

on their progress, along with some photographs to share.

The first step was to identify a staging area. They worked with Dan and agreed on the lower parking lot just outside the music wing. From time to time, we saw a crane stationed there to help bring new supplies up to the roof, or to bring old roof panels down.



The first part of the project involved removing the old steel panels. We received updates each day on what section of the roof panels were removed.



During this removal process for the flat rubber roof areas on the corners, 552 board feet of wet insulation was discovered and replaced at a total cost of \$3,036.

Here is a photo of what the roof looked like as the old steel panels were being removed.

Once panels were removed, a self-adhesive underlayment was placed. This membrane is water and fire resistant, and is the part that looks white in the photo below:





Work was disrupted for a few days in October due to rain, high winds and a funeral.

Then in November, work began to install the new steel roof panels and trim. The crane returned to lift the new panels up to the roof.

As of this printing, there remains a few days of work left for sheet metal workers to do up on the roof, which will be done as weather permits. Here is an additional photo of the new roof install in progress:

### Maintenance Minute

It has been a very busy couple months at Good Sam, starting when I received a call from Jan on a Sunday morning. She informed me that there was an alarm going off on our boilers. I came in to find they were both at zero pressure. This means that they lost all of their water somewhere within the pipes that go throughout the building. I found two boiler pumps leaking water in the tunnel.

With help from Mike, our Owens mechanical technician who troubleshoots and does major repairs to our HVAC equipment, we were able to rebuild one pump and had to replace the other. After the repair, we opened the valves near these pumps and began to add water. Everything seemed to be running fine at that point, and we could finally get the heat back. The affected areas were the Music Wing, Cindy and Kim's offices, various small radiators near the Peace Garden entrance, and two mechanical rooms. But upon further checks, we then found the pressure was dropping by the minute. Figuring it was just air in the system, we released that, but the pressure still kept dropping quite rapidly. Mike and I each made at least three trips around all the tunnels to try and find another leak. That could be the only reason, at that point, that the pressure was still dropping.

After two hours and still not being able to pinpoint this leak's exact location, I had to call Greg from American Leak Detection. What they did was turn the water on full blast, forcing water through the pipes. They used a device called an acoustic

microphone that they put on the ground, and with headphones they went around listening for a louder than normal sound of water going through pipes. This sound would indicate a leak and could then pinpoint the exact location.

With the help of that technology, they were able to find a faulty pipe near the Teacher

Resource Room and Peace Garden window. Then came the task of fixing it. Mike and I had to determine exactly where these lines ran, in hopes

marked area where the leak was found

we could isolate the location and then continue to direct water to the other affected areas.

Interestingly, we were able to reference blueprints from 1978 to find the specific mapping of these water lines. We determined there were two

lines that fed that area. One being the feed line and the other being a return line in the wall of the Teacher Resource Room. We had to cut a large hole in the wall, and were then able to cut these two lines and cap the ends off. Thankfully this only took out one radiator below the Peace Garden windows.

We will determine in the future if we need to jackhammer the floor up and fix that leak for good. Since there is already furnace heat in this area from the office, we may not have to. Thanks to Jan alerting me, we were able to stabilize and remedy the situation in a timely manner.
