Pastor's Page

All earth is waiting...to see the Promised One.

These are the opening words of one of my favorite Advent hymns, *Toda la Tierra* (All Earth Is Waiting), UMH #210. The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." During Advent, we find ourselves waiting for the "arrival" of the baby Jesus, or the "coming" of Christ among us...anxiously waiting for Christmas Day.

A big part of waiting involves getting ready. Children might prepare a list of presents they hope Santa will bring. Adults might send out invitations to social gatherings they are hosting. And, of course, there is shopping for gifts.

Sometimes in the frenzy of getting ready we forget what it is we are waiting for. We see Christmas Eve, or Christmas Day, or perhaps the weekend before, or the weekend after...whatever date we will gather with family or friends...as a stressful deadline for which we will have to have all the shopping and baking and cooking and cleaning done. And in the midst of the countdown, we forget about the Christ in Christmas.

We forget that we are waiting for "Emmanuel," or "God with us." We forget that we are waiting to see the "Promised One." We focus on the frenzy and stress around us, and lose sight of the real reason for the season.

Who will be today's prophet, announcing the coming of the "Prince of Peace?" Are we ready as a church to be such a prophet? And since "I am the church; you are the church; we are the church together," I must ask, are you and I ready to be such prophets?

I think the world is looking for such a prophetic voice to cut through the frenzy and the stress we create for ourselves and one another. The words of the hymn continue...All the world, bound and struggling, seeks true liberty...it cries out for justice and searches for the truth. I think the world is looking for a different way...a way out of the frenzy and stress... a world in which no one is bound and struggling anymore.

This Advent season during worship we will join in God's chorus while crying out for justice and searching for the truth. We'll do this by taking a closer look at a few African American Spirituals and learning what we can from their stories of origin to understand better how we can earnestly seek true liberty...for all.

I hope you will join me on this journey as we gather online or in person each Sunday leading up to Christmas. All earth is waiting...to see the

Promised One. While we are waiting this year, let's prepare to show the world the true liberty that comes through Christ.


