The Times They Are A-Changin'

You know that because of the wars waged against my father David from all sides, he could not build a temple But now the Lord my God has given me rest on every side, and there is no adversary or disaster. I intend, therefore, to build a temple ... 1 Kings 5:3-5 NIV

These words come from Solomon, David's son, who is now on the throne. Whereas David's reign was filled with accounts of battles and conspiracies, Solomon's reign is going to be filled with accounts of divine fulfillment, wisdom, teaching, and building projects. These are different times, indeed.

There is a great settling taking place, a movement from neurotic Saul, to warrior David and now to design-builder Solomon. How would Solomon have faired as king in a different time? Would his wisdom have been so noteworthy under different circumstances, when perhaps different leadership skills were needed? Solomon was able to get away with giving the orders that he did only because of the groundwork done before him by Saul and David. Solomon was able to build the great Solomon's Temple to the Lord only because the times were finally ripe for such things to come forth, and his skill set was a perfect missional match for the tasks that needed to be done.

What work are we able now to do because of the efforts of those who have gone before us? How do the times and circumstances that surround our "temple-building" activities today both limit what we will be able to accomplish and also expand the opportunities that are possible?

What about these times, which are far different than previous times, are ripe for new God-projects to be undertaken?

Lord God, give us wisdom to know the answers to these questions for this time and place. May we be about building your kin-dom in never-before-seen ways so that all may come and be blessed by you. Grant us peace to accept what we cannot change, the courage to change what we can, and the wisdom to know the difference. Amen.



Spotlight on Beacon



Good Samaritan has supported Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative for many years. Many of you have attended their annual fund-raising luncheon in the fall. The next one is "Light the Way Home," September 30, from noon to 1:00 pm, at the McNamara Alumni Center, 200 Oak St. SE, at the University of Minnesota. If you would like to carpool with other Good Samaritans, please call Dave Knutson at 612-859-2940.

The State of Minnesota is providing an opportunity to help Beacon and benefit yourself at the same time. Briefly, the State of Minnesota will provide an 85% state income tax credit for every dollar you contribute to the Housing Tax Credit Program (minimum of \$1,000.00, maximum of \$2,000,000). You will receive an 85% tax credit on your state income tax. For instance, if you contribute \$2,000 to the program, you receive a reduction of your state income tax of \$1,700. Information about the program can be found at: www.mnhousing.gov/shtc-contribution.html

You can benefit Beacon by specifying that your contribution goes to Prairie Pointe or Bimosedaa. Check out the information at Beacon Interfaith Housing: www.beaconinterfaith.org/ mnhousingtaxcredit. Any contribution not directed to a specific program goes into a general fund for affordable housing. As of May 28, 2024, \$1,284,500 has been contributed to fund affordable housing. At present, the program is funded through 2028.

Hearts & Hammers is a local non-profit organization providing free exterior painting and maintenance assistance for income-qualified homeowners across the Twin Cities. Home improvements consist of exterior painting and minor repairs. The Program Day is expected to consist primarily of exterior home/garage preparation, scraping, priming, painting, and landscape renewal. Volunteers are also needed to do repair and preparation work during the week before.

We start at 8:00 am and are usually done by 4:00 pm or sooner. You can work for a couple of hours, just in the morning or afternoon, or all day. Coffee, water, donuts, and lunch are provided. All materials are donated including paint, brushes, rollers, ladders, and rags. You just need to wear clothes you don't mind getting paint on.
